IMPORTANT ITEMS

In order to strengthen the theme of Fraternity that I stressed when I was elected as your Grand Knight, I would like to take the time to address a few issues that have been brought up over the past year or so. As you know, our council has been trying to get the members to provide updated contact information for all current members.

In addition to having the correct mailing address for our members, we are trying to do compile a complete list of member e-mails. The ability of the Grand Knight to notify the membership of up to the minute issues affecting the council or to remind members of upcoming events is imperative if this council is to thrive in the 21st century. Over the past two or three years we have continually run a notice in the monthly newsletter requesting current information (including an e-mail address) for all members. Right now, we have 70+ e-mails, which is a start, but it is not enough when we have roster of 350+ members.

The e-mail list also allows us to reduce the number of newsletters that are mailed each month. As it stands now, I am e-mailing 70+ newsletters every month. However, the newsletter still costs the council around \$3,000 a year for photocopying, labels, and postage. Starting with the next Columbian year (July 2011) the newsletter will no longer be mailed to each member automatically. If you require a mailed copy, **you must notify the council in writing**. You can e-mail me (see page 1) or mail a note to the council with all your current information.

The website also now has a link where members can list their companies or their trade/talents. This will allow members who need work done to find a brother who performs that type of work. Also, if a member is currently out of work, other members may know of a company that is hiring where they can offer a referral.

I feel that if our council begins to move forward with these initiatives it will strengthen our organization both fraternally and financially. I look forward to your cooperation with respect to these items.

COLUMBIAN CLUB REPORT

The proposal for the electrical work behind the bar was approved on January 18, 2011. The work requires the power to the bar area to be shut off while work is done. Therefore, it will be scheduled sometime between the Super Bowl and the 'Fat Saturday' Social. The date will be posted on the website and at the bar once it has been established...sorry for the inconvenience.

The club recently received its first fuel delivery for the season, which causes the boiler to shutdown. Whenever we get a fuel delivery, it causes air in the line, which in turn makes the boiler think there is no fuel and shuts down. It take about 20-30 minutes of trying to get the fuel to flow. Also, as we know, there are holes in the tank, which allows water to get into the fuel. LaPenta noticed the water when he replaced the clogged fuel filter. We will have to have the water pumped out of the tank again.

Lastly, after reviewing the finances for the club over the past two years, it is apparent that our income has been drastically reducing. Our income has dropped roughly \$12,000 over the past 24 months (\$500/month). In addition to the cost savings I am proposing with minimizing the printing/mailling costs of the newsletter, I propose that we institute our version of the St. James Powerball lottery to our club. I think a once a year 50/50, drawn at the Changing of the Keys social, would give future Grand Knights a financial shot in the arm at the start of their term. More details on this as they become available.

ROE V. WADE IS STATE SANCTIONED GENOCIDE

I am taking advantage of the fact that February is Black History Month to shed some light on abortion and its impact on the black community. As bad as abortion is in general, the impact it has had on the black population in this country can only be described as genocide. A few years ago, the documentary *Maafa21* (produced by Mark Crutcher) was released, which explained in detail how the history of the modern day abortion industry is rooted in the elimination of races, particularly the black race. The following is an excerpt from an article written by Katie Walker for the July/August issue of 'Celebrate Life':

Maafa, a Swahili term meaning great tragedy or disaster, refers to the over 500 years of oppression suffered by Africans and their descendants under slavery, colonialism, imperialism, racism, and—as *Maafa 21* proves—eugenic birth control and abortion. In the year since the film was released, it has lit the country on fire, and inspired a new wave of activism and passion for justice—given birth, if you will, to a movement that views abortion and other attacks on human beings' lives not as a parallel to slavery and racism, but as their direct continuation.

Eugenics is a particularly ugly word. It evokes thoughts of mass murder committed in the name of racial purity. It's usually spoken in the same breath with references to Adolf Hitler's Nazi regime. But seldom is it applied to Margaret Sanger, Planned Parenthood founder and unabashed eugenics promoter, and even less to Ruth Bader Ginsburg, who is routinely fawned over as "progressive" by secular humanists. "God times things in the way He wants them," Mark Crutcher (*Maafa21* producer) observed. "And that was crystal clear when Ginsburg [less than a month after *Maafa 21*'s premiere] comes out and says everything we're saying is true ... The day I saw that, I saw God's hand in this thing every inch of the way. This [film] is the tool we've been waiting for, for a long time."

GENOCIDE BY THE NUMBERS

Table 3 of National Vital Statistics Reports, Volume 58, Number 4 (October 14, 2009, available at www.cdc.gov) reports that in 2005, there were 587,000 live births versus 452,000 abortions of black pre-born babies. According to Table F of NVSR, Volume 58, Number 8 (December 23, 2009), in 2005, there were 292,808 deaths in the African-American community from causes other than abortion. In his June 14 online column, Conflict of Interest, Walter B. Hoye II (see *Celebrate Life*, July-August 2009), CEO of the California Civil Rights Foundation (www.civilrightsfoundation.org), pointed out that these figures reveal there was a "black life deficit" of 157,808 in 2005, and his calculation doesn't include the 177,000 black pre-born babies who died in 2005 from causes other than induced abortion. According to the Guttmacher Institute's May 2010 Facts on Induced Abortion in the United States (see www.guttmacher.org), "Thirty percent of abortions occur to non-Hispanic black women." Keep in mind that 1) the 2000 census indicated that only about 12 percent of the U.S. population is African-American, compared to about 75 percent for the white population (including Hispanics) and about 12 percent for other racial categories (see Overview of Race and Hispanic Origin, a Census 2000 Brief issued in March 2001, at www.census.gov); and 2) these abortion statistics don't reflect the fact that hormonal contraceptives can cause very early (and undetected) abortions. According to the Klan Parenthood web site, "Since 1973, abortion has reduced the [U.S.] black population by over 25 percent." BLOOD DRIVE

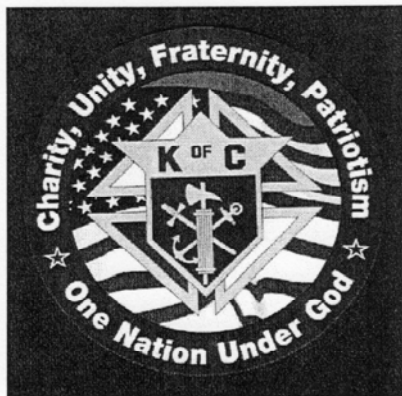
