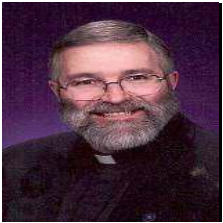

## From our Worthy Chaplain . . . Msgr. Charles Cicerale



Dear Family;

We're moving quickly into January and Lent is only a few weeks away. But the Gospel today recounts Jesus' first "signs." It is now the second "Mystery of light" when you pray the rosary ~ The wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. What a beautiful and strong faith Mary places in Jesus in today's gospel:

*When the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from, called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."*

*John 2:1-11*

Here is a story holding a truth about this gospel: "But will he hold your purse?" An oncologist tells her friends, "Everything I know about marriage I learned in my cancer clinic." For 20 years she has cared for women with breast cancer. She has watched couples cope with every kind of crisis. She has been inspired by husbands and wives whose marriages were like "beacons" that illuminated even the dark fear of cancer.

But this doctor has a special place in her heart for the "purse watchers." Husbands who drive their wives in for their radiation treatments and sit side by side in the waiting room without much chitchat. When her name is called out, she stands up, takes a deep breath, and hands her purse to her husband. Then she disappears into the radiation room and he keeps vigil over the pocketbook on his lap.

He doesn't read, he doesn't talk, he sits there, holding hard onto the pocketbook, his big gnarled knuckles clamped around the clasp dealing with the reality that 20 feet away technologists are aiming a complicated x-ray machine at the mother of his kids.

The doctor tells her unmarried girl friends that these are the kind of guys they should be looking for: "A guy who knows that while much of marriage is a 50-50 give and take, sometimes it's more like 80-20, and that's OK, even when the 80-20 phase goes on and on. A man who truly doesn't care what somebody's breast looks like after cancer surgery (and) knows the value of a cool, damp washcloth.

A partner who knows to remove the computer mouse from a woman's hand when she types phrases like breast cancer death sentence in a Google search. And most of all, a partner who will sit in a cancer clinic waiting room and hold hard onto the purse on his lap."
