

Dear People of God-Holy Ones,
 Blessed Advent as we draw close now to Holy Christmas!
 In today's Gospel we hear: 'The crowds asked John the Baptist, 'What should we do?' (Lk 3:10-18)
 Here is a story with an answer!
 Whitney Kropp is a 16 year old sophomore at Ogemaw Heights High School in West Branch, Michigan. "She is quiet and shy, a self-described "outcast." Whitney is not one of the popular or cool kids. This fall, to her surprise, she was nominated as the sophomore representative for this year's Homecoming Court.

At first she was shocked and excited, until she learned that her election was a cruel prank. Some kids thought it would be fun if an unpopular student won; once they got Whitney elected, they wasted no time mocking her in the halls and posting their taunts on Face Book.

The popular football player voted to escort her withdrew his name because he didn't want to be linked with her. Whitney said she felt "like trash;" she was so embarrassed at being "this big old joke" at school she thought about killing herself. But her family and friends, especially her mom and sister, urged her to stay on the Homecoming Court.

As word of the prank spread through town, the community rallied around her. Local businesses provided Whitney's Homecoming gown, jewelry, shoes, make-up and hairstyling. Friends made up *Team Whitney* T-shirts to wear when she was introduced at the Homecoming football game.

So Whitney stuck with it, and wowed the crowds at Homecoming. Because of the love and concern of those closest to her, Whitney had the last laugh.

Whitney doesn't know who engineered the prank, but had this message for other students dealing with the bullying: "Don't let {the bullies} bring you down. Stand up for what you believe in and go with your heart and your gut. That's

what I did and look at me now. I'm just as happy as can be."

What started out as a heartless and cruel prank on a 16 year old girl turned into a moment of grace for the community who stood by her; what could have been a devastating embarrassment for Whitney (with tragic consequences perhaps) turned into a singularly prophetic stand against bullying. One young woman's humiliation brought a community together.

The compassion extended to Whitney and Whitney's brave response to the bullies is the "good news" preached by John the Baptizer. What happened in West Branch is a sign of the "expectation" that "fills" every human heart for the coming of God's kingdom of justice, peace, and reconciliation.

In the baptism initiated by John, we are called to be witnesses of God's love by the love we extend to others; we are called to be precursors of his justice by our unflinching commitment to what is right and good for others; we are called to be reflections of the light of God's Christ in our forgiveness, mercy, and compassion for others; we are called to imitate the example of Christ the Servant in our humble, joy- filled service to others.

Right to Life Report

There are two recent events, to which I ask you to direct your thoughts.

First, Belgium has had a euthanasia law in effect for the past 10 years. It was enacted to allow people over the age of 18 who have a terminal disease, to choose to end their life. It may seem reasonable, considering the potential pain and suffering, to allow *an adult* to make *his or her own conscious decision* to end his or her life. However, as with all “progressive” socialist ideas, current laws never seem to go far enough: Now the Socialist Party in Belgium is proposing a bill that would extend the current euthanasia law to include *minors* with incurable or terminal illnesses...*as well as* adults suffering with Alzheimer’s disease. (Who else will be next?) Of course, a panel of “professionals” will review their cases prior to granting permission to be euthanized. (Now where have we heard that before?) Is it really “crazy” to think that “death panels” will exist here in the U.S. in our lifetime? For those who think, “it can’t happen here,” the New Jersey Assembly is currently considering a measure (A3328) similar to Belgium’s law. Already, three other states — Washington, Oregon and Montana — allow doctor-assisted suicide.

Secondly, I am sure we all either said prayers, shed tears or both when we heard about the horrific mass murder of 20 kindergarten children and six adults in Newtown, Connecticut, just before Christmas. This tragedy will be a lightning rod for debate for years to come, as we point fingers and try to figure out how to make sure something like this never happens again. And well we should. But why do we not see the same problem-solving concern and outrage over “legalized” abortion? Since 1973, abortion has taken the lives of more than *50 million babies in the United States alone*, with the full consent of none other than their own mothers and the permission of their government. A baby is aborted every 18 seconds, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, so in the time it took you to read this article, another six babies have been added to the body count.

The Connecticut murders and the death toll from Roe v. Wade have one common thread: Innocent children were murdered by a person who **CHOSE** to kill them. In both situations, the children had **NO** say in the matter. Why do we say the Connecticut victims were murdered, but abortion’s victims are “just statistics”? Did any of us over the age of 50 expect that our country would be in the state that it is now? In 1960, did any of us imagine that God would be forced out of our schools and our communities? In a country that declared at its founding that all men are endowed by their Creator with unalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness...in a country that declared that government is instituted to secure those rights, we have instead allowed our government to gradually be given more and more power to destroy life without consent. What does that mean for the future of our country? More importantly, what does it mean for our *eternal* happiness, especially the eternal happiness of the women who “choose” abortion? First contraception, then abortion, now assisted suicide...a slippery slope indeed...to where?
