Keith took the time to explain to me that mums are the traditional Mother's Day flower and the significance of the colors that people select. E.g. A white mum would indicate that your Mom has passed, a yellow mum indicates that your mom is still with you while a violet mum signifies love. I was impressed with the amount of work that it takes to organize and set up the flowers. Keith says that when he did all the work himself it took over 8 hours.

Keith is also the Right to Life chairman for St. James Church and is passionate about his desire to honor Mother's that have chosen to keep their infants. Keith believes that on Mother's Day we should honor all of the mothers that have contributed to our growth and development/

Richard Ungvary was born on September 27, 1930 and passed away on Thursday, February 22, 2018.

Richard was a resident of Kentucky at the time of passing. Richard took his first second and third degrees in 1951 and was a Knight of this council for 66 years. Richard loved bowling and was on the Council #857 team that qualified for the National Championships. A photograph (reproduced on the left) of the members of this team stands proudly in our Council Hall. I Believe Richard is the member shown on the lower right.

George Dwyer passed away on May 3, 2018. He was 84 years old. Born in Port Reading, he resided in Edison for many years before moving to Spring Hill, FL 25 years ago.

George was a Knight of Council #857 from 1952 to 1993 before his move to Florida.

Mr. Dwyer served with the Woodbridge Township Board of Education for 30 years, first as a teacher and eventually retiring as Director of Title 1 and Title 9 for the school district. He proudly served his country with the 82nd Airborne Division of the United States Army from 1956 until 1958, was a communicant of Saint Theresa Catholic Church in Spring Hill, FL and 4th degree member of Assembly 1721 in Spring Hill, FL.



Thomas Michael Keating, 78, of Monroe Township, passed away at home peacefully, surrounded by those who loved him, on May 10, 2018. Tom was a communicant of St. James Church, Jamesburg and a former communicant of St. James Church, Woodbridge.

Tom was a member of the Knights of Columbus Council #857 for 33 years. Tom took his first, second and third degrees in 1964.

His late brother-in-law- Jack Cerulo always said, “EVERYONE loves Tom!”

Robert J. Jardot Jr. (Bob) passed away on Saturday, May 26, 2018 at his home after a long illness surrounded by his loving family. Bob took his first, second and third degrees in 1976 and was a lifetime member of our council for 42 years.

Since the June newsletter is between two major holidays, Memorial Day & the Fourth of July this article is most appropriate. I understand that the Great Grand Niece of Edward M. Kelly is arranging to have a Mass said for him on 11/11/18.



TEMPUS FUGIT – 1918 – MEMENTO MORI

Exactly 100 years ago The United States of America had joined the fight in the “War to end all Wars”. Over 4 million American men would be mobilized; 116,708 of them would never return home. The Knights of Columbus would do its part, raising \$14 million dollars (\$250,000,000 in today’s dollars) to provide for welfare centers in the U.S. and abroad. These clubs, run by K of C personal nicknamed ‘Caseys’, provided for recreation and a few of the amenities of home to any serviceman regardless of race or religion. Basically, this was the USO of its day and was cherished by the ‘Doughboys’ overseas.

Council #857’s Grand Knight, Thomas Cody, responded to the call of duty and enlisted; as did 27 other members of our council who would go on to join the American Expeditionary Force. Our council also raised money for the war effort and paid all the dues of its members in the armed forces. Edward M. Kelly, Council #857’s Treasurer, was killed at Thiaucourt Wood during the Battle of Saint-Mihiel, France, September 21st, 1918.

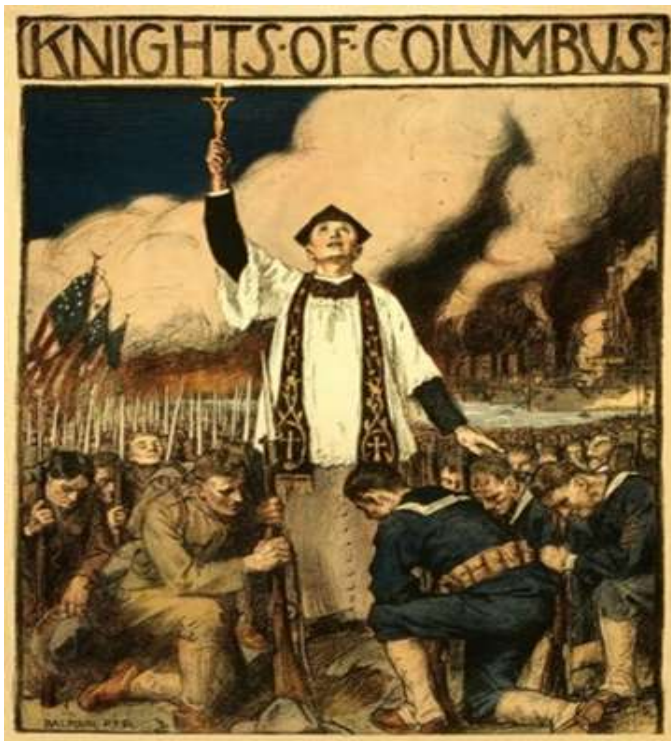
The first American to die in the war was a Brother Knight; so was the last. The first man to win the Distinguished Service Cross was a Knight. We also count a two-time Medal of Honor winner in WWI, Sergeant Major Daniel Daly, within our ranks.

However, World War I was not the greatest killer of this year. The Spanish Flu pandemic infected an estimated 500 million people worldwide in 1918 - about one-third of the planet’s population - and killed an estimated 35 million people, including some 675,000 Americans. The conditions in 1918 were not so far removed from the “Black Death” of the Middle-Ages. Citizens were ordered to wear masks, schools, theaters and businesses were shuttered and bodies piled up in makeshift morgues.

Since indoor meetings were banned by ordinance, the Knights of Council #857 met outside on the corner of Main Street and Route 35. It was decided they would volunteer at the many makeshift hospitals in the area, providing much relief to the citizens of our community in their most desperate time of need.

On September 29th, 1918 our Council's founder, Rev. John J. Griffin, passed away at the age of 62 and was buried in Saint James Cemetery. Our Fourth Degree Assembly is named in his honor.

The Great War famously ended at the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918. After a second resurgence the Spanish Flu would finally end as well. The year 1918 would have a profound effect on all who lived through it and alter the course of American history, and Council #857's, for the next 100 years.
