## Columbian Club Report

Brothers:

As many of you are aware the council was looking for many ways to raise money and save money. Recently our first month's utility bill came in after we switched from PSE&G to Starion Energy. I'm proud to say that we saved approximately 150.00 in that one month alone. Add that up and that equates to over a 1000.000 a year savings alone. Since the cost of Oil is rising and one delivery is upwards to 2500.00 we need to find ways to reduce our reliance on the energy and fuels we use. The next endeavor will be to replace the oil tank with a 275 gallon tank which is smaller than what we have, but it's new, and the goal is to have this in place within the next few months.

Outstanding repairs left

1. Line under the bar to the glass wash sink has a small leak.
2. A toilet needs to be replaced in the Bar as the tank itself is cracked, so the water is off, this is not ideal so the sooner the better. (The toilet was brought down from the attic and is awaiting installation)
3. The Ceiling in the living room is almost complete but still needs to have the molding replaced, and repainted
4. The cement walkway in the front of the Hall needs to be replaced.

A few new items that were brought up in last Columbian Club meeting

1. Fixing the Toilet
2. Replacing the Oil Tank with a newer smaller one, and have it stationed outside the building, we are checking on the building code as we speak.

Lastly, some quick things to remember –

- Please do not turn the heat to over 65; it was close to 75(77 to be exact based on an atomic temperature reading) in the club last week, and that is warm enough to grow a Coconut Tree. Tropical weather in our council is not something we need, and certainly we can't afford to pay for at this time. For those living in Florida it was warmer up here last week.
- Please leave the switch for the alarm alone – folks who need to get in downstairs with their cards cannot, none of us need to touch this.
- Please turn the lights off when you're done; lock the doors, and thank you very much for your continued support and helping the council.

As always we could use some help fixing some of the items in the council and if you're able to spare a few minutes to do some work please reach out to me.

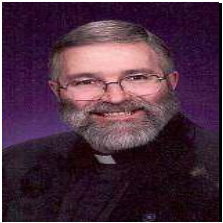

## From our Worthy Chaplain . . . Msgr. Charles Cicerale



Dear Brothers and Sisters;

On Ash Wednesday, you heard one of two statements or calls to action: "Repent and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return."

The ashes are blessed and imposed after the homily as we observe a day of universal fast and abstinence (from meat) in the Church. This graced season of renewal and preparation for Easter has a twofold theme: of repentance and baptism as the season disposes both the catechumens (those seeking entry into the community) and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery – the dying and rising of Jesus Christ. The faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises at Easter.

If you are reading this, you no doubt wish to explore the reality of God in your life. By reading and reflecting on the Scriptures, and by considering how other spiritual seekers have discovered God at work in their lives, you will see that your faith seeks expression in your life. We want to learn how to discover God in all the ways that the hidden God might be revealed to us, and then to shape our lives in response to God's presence with us and in us.

Back on January 6<sup>th</sup> we celebrated the Epiphany of the Lord, and the Gospel of the day (Mt.2:1-12) was the story of the visit of the Magi to Jesus. The Greek word Epiphany means to show forth, especially a divine revelation. The lesson is clear: Jesus is for everybody since the "Magi from the East" represent the non-Jewish world come to worship the newborn king. At the end of Matthew's gospel Jesus will tell his disciples to go and teach all nations and baptize them.

Don't leave anybody out. And that's how Christianity became a world religion preached to all peoples. But that story of the Magi tells us about the "reaction" or "response" of three groups of people to the presence of Jesus. Firstly, there are the pagan Magi who seek him out, guided by the faint light of a star; secondly, the representatives of the religion of the Temple, the chief priests and scribes, who remain indifferent; and thirdly, the powerful King Herod, who only sees Jesus as a threat.

So here we are on the doorstep of a forty day season to take stock and, with God's help, examine our response to Jesus at this moment in our spiritual journey.

So you ask yourself: Am I actively seeking, or indifferent, or do I find Jesus a threat? Look closely and remember you are dust and in light of eternity, is it time, now, for you to perhaps repent of some attitudes, some actions, some words and start afresh to believe in the Gospel?

Here is a quick way to inventory your present choices. If I am actively seeking a deeper intimacy with Jesus how do I pray; with genuine candor or not?

Do I take time to read the Scriptures and meditate and listen to Jesus speak to my heart both privately and communally in the company of the "assembly of the faithful" each Sabbath?

Do I support the Church by feeding the hungry or visiting the sick or imprisoned?

Do I come to church services late and leave early and spend more time with my electronic toys than I do with people in need?
