The members that are two (2) years in arrears are:

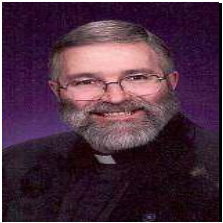

## From our Worthy Chaplain . . . Msgr. Charles Cicerale



Dear People of God;

**So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish.**

**Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, “Do you love me?” and said to Jesus, “Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.”**

**John 21: 1-19**

### ***Your indestructible net***

There are no ends to the demands made on a parent. Regardless of the ages of your children, the expectations never end. There are times when every Mom and Dad feels completely exhausted — there is nothing more to give. Yet we find that there’s always a little more left than we think — a little more patience, a little more understanding, a little more forgiveness. Our parental “nets” may strain at times, but they never tear. We are part of a group working on some parish or community project. We might have had doubts about the value of our own contributions. We wondered if we could keep up — these other folks seem to know what they’re doing. But once we saw what could be done, once we realized the good we could do, once we met the people we could help, we found that our “nets” were strong enough. Someone at your school is struggling: They just moved here. They’re having trouble making friends. They’re not keeping up in class. You’d like to help them, but you’re not one of the cool kids or smart kids; you’re afraid you might embarrass them or that you will make matters worse or you will be told to mind your own business. But, more often than not, your simple Hello or How’s it going? may be the beginning of helping them start to put it together. Your own “net” is stronger than you think . . .

**In today’s Gospel, the Risen Jesus makes his presence known to Peter and his fishing companions by calling them to cast their nets off the “right” side of the boat. Despite their doubts and frustrations, they do as Jesus instructs and end up with an incredible catch — and, as the writer of the Fourth Gospel notes, their nets did not tear. When we act out of love, when we put aside our own fears and expectations for the sake of others, when we seek to imitate the selfless compassion of the Risen One, we will discover, Jesus promises, how strong and indestructible our own “nets” are, that we are able to realize a “catch” of good things despite the hopelessness of the night, the fear of the unknown deep, the weight of the catch we struggle to haul to shore.**

### ***Making space for forgiveness***

In his book **Living a Life That Matters**, Rabbi Harold Kushner tells the story of a woman in his congregation who periodically would come to him to complain about her marriage. She did everything around the house, she said. Her husband was uninvolved with the children; he was emotionally distant from her. The rabbi tried to be sympathetic, aware that he was hearing only her side. Why did she stay in the marriage? the rabbi asked her. She said she didn’t have the heart to leave her husband. He would be helpless without her; his life would be empty. Then, one day, she came to the rabbi in tears. *He* had left *her*. His parting words were that he wanted to be more of a husband and more of a father, but she wouldn’t let him. He realized that those roles did not come easy to him because he didn’t know how to fulfill them, his own father not having set a very good example for him. But he felt that, instead of letting him try to learn how to be a good father and husband, his wife chose to claim those areas as her own and left no space for him.

**In today’s Gospel, Jesus makes “space” for reconciliation and forgiveness in his relationship with Peter. Peter has spectacularly failed Jesus, denying him three times on Good Friday morning. But Jesus makes “space” to put what happened aside and lift up Peter’s faith. Jesus asks Peter three times — the same number of times that Peter denied him — to profess his love for him. We can hear the pain and hurt in Peter’s voice — but also the conviction in his response after Jesus asks the third time: “Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you.” Jesus is not taunting Peter but calling Peter to move beyond the past and to take on the challenges of apostleship. In forgiving Peter as he does, in affecting reconciliation with Peter, Jesus transforms Peter’s regrets and shame into a new understanding of the Gospel that the fisherman has witnessed. Sadly, the two spouses that Rabbi Kushner writes about are unable to make that kind of “space” for one another’s mistakes and fumbles. Through constantly seeking to make “space” for reconciliation with others, in calling forth the good that others possess despite our doubts and disappointments, in possessing the greatness of heart to forgive and seek forgiveness, we enable Easter resurrection to take place in our own families, neighborhoods and communities.**
