Columbian Club Report

Brothers:

The current House Fund collected to date is \$650.00; we still have a long way to go. I have been pleased that folks have been contributing to the House Fund, and 25% of our total membership has contributed to the House Fund.

On another note there are still other repairs in the house that will need to be taken care of but right now we are going to focus on raising capital to pay our expenses and to hopefully continue providing for charities which is what we are here to do. Last month the council did not make any money and had a net loss over a \$1000.00. We have been trending upward so this was the 1st month we had negative monthly balance. We want to keep the ball rolling and the positive cash flow, and the way we do that is by doing the little things to save money or raise money, which brings me to our next point. We will have oil bills to cover very shortly too.

We will be looking to complete a utility/energy audit on our House bills, and if the utility/energy audit reveals we overpaid on any bill, then we will get that money back. I will share the results with you upon completion. Our Brother Danny Langon Jr. is driving this initiative.

The Council newsletter costs approximately \$200.00 dollars a month to print, hours to label, and prepare for mailing, and then \$45.00 or so to send out at the post office. If we could move to a fully digitized version the council would save about \$2500.00 a year, enough to pay a large portion of our oil bill, electric bill, or donate to charity. Right now several of you have returned your slips back to council to inform me of how you would prefer the newsletter, and more are coming back with the electronic copy selected, which is good as that will reduce our cost slightly. In the upcoming year we will examine the number of mailings and look to digitize the newsletter almost entirely.

We are also in the process of instituting a Maître D service with our Hall rentals. That would mean that there would be an additional \$50.00 fee to be applied to hall rentals(which would be given to the Knight serving as the Maître D at the event) so there would always be a Knight on duty to ensure doors are locked, A/C, heat, and lights are off, and the garbage is put outside.

There will be an opportunity for whoever would like to participate as a Maître D to be placed on a list, which will be on a rotational basis. We have several folks already lined up, but we would be looking to move forward with this beginning in the New Year, so there's time to add to the list. The officers agreed on a job description and what the role of the Maître D would entail, and this was brought up in our business meeting on 10/16. If you would like to be on the Maître D list please reach out to me and let me know.

A special thanks to Brother Kenny Egan for fixing the Air Conditioning unit in the Bar area. It's appreciated.

If you or another Brother Knight has skills to repair a leaking sink, toilet, paint, spackle, etc., please let us know, since we are always looking for help getting some of the minor issues resolved before they become large problems.

Dear People of God,

As the calendar year moves from fall into winter reminding us of nature's downward cycle of decay and death, the liturgical year counters with the start of a new life cycle beginning with Advent, our annual celebration of how God overcomes the death cycle through the power of Jesus' incarnation that continues in the upward movement to God through his ministry, death, resurrection and ascension. The question is, what can we do to hasten the transformation of our lives through God's presence with us? The answer: Each day we must make sure that evil stops right here and right now with us, and one way we can do that in our nation is through our voting. So to help us participate more responsibly in the November 6 elections. Please consider reading the U.S. Bishops' call to political responsibility "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" available online at:

www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/faothful-citizenshipforming-consciences-for-faithful-citizenship-document.cfm).

So let us use not only our personal choices but also our election choices to help our nation become more like the community of justice, love and peace that Jesus envisioned. I have some excerpts from the Bishop's statement below.

The Challenge of Forming Consciences

Our nation faces political challenges that demand urgent moral choices. We are a nation at war, with all of its human costs; a country often divided by race and ethnicity; a nation of immigrants struggling with immigration. We are an affluent society where too many live in poverty; part of a global community confronting terrorism and facing urgent threats to our environment; a culture built on families, where some now question the value of marriage and family life.

We pride ourselves on supporting human rights, but we fail even to protect the fundamental right to life, especially for unborn children.

We bishops seek to help Catholics form their consciences in accordance with the truth, so they can make sound moral choices in addressing these challenges. We do not tell Catholics how to vote. The responsibility to make

political choices rests with each person and his or her properly formed conscience.

Why does the Church teach about issues affecting public policy?

The Church's obligation to participate in shaping the moral character of society is a requirement of our faith, a part of the mission given to us by Jesus Christ. Faith helps us see more clearly the truth about human life and dignity that we also understand through human reason. As people of both faith and reason, Catholics are called to bring truth to political life and to practice Christ's commandment to "love one another" (Jn 13:34). According to Pope Benedict XVI, "charity must animate the entire lives of the lay faithful and therefore also their political activity, lived as 'social charity'" (*Deus Caritas Est*, no. 29).

The United States Constitution protects the right of individual believers and religious bodies to participate and speak out without government interference, favoritism, or discrimination. Civil law should recognize and protect the Church's right and responsibility to participate in society without abandoning our central moral convictions. Our nation's tradition of pluralism is enhanced, not threatened, when religious groups and people of faith bring their convictions into public life. The Catholic community brings to the political dialogue a consistent moral framework and broad experience serving those in need.

Who in the Church should participate in political life?

In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation. As Catholics, we should be guided more by our moral convictions than by our attachment to a political party or interest group. In today's environment, Catholics may feel politically disenfranchised, sensing that no party and few candidates fully share our comprehensive commitment to human life and dignity. Catholic lay women and men need to act on the Church's moral principles and become more involved: running for office, working within political parties, and communicating concerns to elected officials. Even those who cannot vote should raise their voices on matters that affect their lives and the common good.
