Columbian Club Report

Brothers:

Our council needs your help and as your Grand Knight I need your help in restoring our House.

On March 4, 2013, our council will be celebrating its 109th year as a fixture in our community and our church. Our council has weathered many economic downturns, recessions, and even a depression. As you know, this current 'great recession' has had a devastating effect on the financial stability of many organizations and ours is not immune to these conditions.

Being in existence for 109 years, and in our current location for many years, it is inevitable that the years do take its toll on the infrastructure. We made many repairs throughout the council home over the past few years, including: renovating the bar, repairing the tile roof, replacing the roof over the main porch, installing new electrical panels, and painting the hall. All of these projects have been paid for with monies raised by the membership at our functions. However, there are many areas of the hall and council building that is in need of repair.

Due to the extent of the repairs required, the council will require a large influx of money. The Officers of the Knights of Columbus Middlesex Council # 857 are asking each member to send in a \$25.00 donation (Checks can be made payable to Knights of Columbus # 857, memo is House Fund) to be placed into a separate House Fund account which is part of our bylaws that applies to each council which operates a Hall outside of a church basement. Keep in mind that the membership will be donating their time to complete this work, whenever possible in order to save money. In addition to the money, we would greatly appreciate it, if members could donate some time doing work around the council home. If you've been away from the council for a long time, take this as an opportunity to reconnect with your council and the membership...if you are a newer member, use this as a way to get involved with your council and make new friends or meet new brothers.

I will provide an update as to the total amount collected which will be part of the next few Council Newsletters. Additionally, I will post what improvements we will be looking to undertake as well as the cost involved. Remember our credo, Unity, Charity, and Fraternity, these values are what makes us Knights and we cannot deliver them without your help, and that help starts in our own house.

We have a long list of projects throughout the building, but the following are the most urgent projects:

Replace the concrete walkway in front of Hall steps facing The Reo Diner.

Replace the ceiling in the 4th Degree Sitting Room, spackle and paint

Replace Ceiling and Light Fixture in the Pool Room

Add an A/C unit in the bar with an "Energy Saver" model to supplement the current A/C unit

If any member would like to help us complete the above projects please let me know.

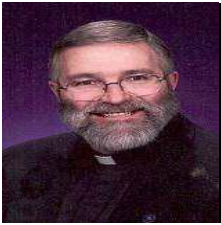

Dear Church of St. James;
 Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever..." John 6:51-58
 Here is a true story called

"Chili Sunday"

At a small church just outside of Pittsburgh, it is the biggest day of the church year, in terms of attendance, after Easter: Chili Sunday.

Every year on a Sunday in mid-January members of the parish make their favorite chili recipe and bring it in a crock-pot to church. Volunteers set out serving bowls on long tables in the church hall, with little placards that identify the person who prepared each bowl. The beef chili is on one table, while the turkey, chicken, and vegetarian chili are on others. People hurry to the hall after church, plunge into the banquet and find their way to seats at the round tables.

The pastor writes that Chili Sunday is a wonderful time for the parish, and not just because of the good food. "It is over bowls of chili that...theology becomes incarnational and takes on the fleshy concerns {parishioners} brought to church that day. What they say is, "How is your job search going? Whether they realize it or not, they're actually asking each other, "Do you think God cares?"
 "After 30 years of pastoral ministry, I have finally

discovered the theology of small talk over a bowl of chili. It's not small at all. The folding tables in the {church} hall are not formal pieces of ecclesiastical furniture like the sanctuary's communion table. But they give us a sacramental glimpse of the Christ who is among us in ordinary places...people crowd into the {hall} for a bowl of chili because their souls hunger from an ordinary variety of holiness. We expect to find Jesus the Savior in the church sanctuary, hospital or places of crises. We yearn to find him on laundry day."

Food is the great unifier among any group of people; at the tables where we break bread, we celebrate family and connect with friends; in sharing the bounty of the harvest, we create communities of support and reconciliation, in calling himself "bread" the simplest and most basic of foods-Jesus connects our most ordinary lives with the compassion and mercy of God. In the bread of the Eucharist, Jesus transforms us, his church, into his own body and blood; in Eucharist, we become for one another the bread of compassion and justice and peace that is Christ. Saint James has its version of "Chili Sunday" called a "Taste of St. James."

We highlight and celebrate the diversity of the Catholic Community of St. James with "homemade" dinners prepared by members of our parish; foods from all over the world and the unique cultures they represent are shared by all. The date is Saturday, September 29th. Keep your eye on the bulletin for details.
